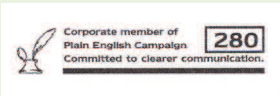
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About... Transition Housing Related Support Service - Birmingham

Friendship's new transition housing related support service in Birmingham, is designed to help people with learning disabilities to live more independently.

What does transition mean?

Transition is a purposeful and planned process of change.

The transition housing related support service enables individuals to be increasingly involved in making decisions and life choices that affect and matter to them most.

What does this service offer?

Daily living skills

Supporting people to gain or improve their daily living skills, such as:

- ▲ planning and cooking meals
- ▲ shopping
- ▲ budgeting
- ▲ looking after where they live

Moving home

Provides support to people with learning difficulties who would like to move into their own accommodation, such as:

- ▲ help with housing applications
- ▲ viewing properties
- ▲ help with moving into a new home
- ▲ supporting individuals to maintain their own tenancy

Help and Advice

Is available on other day to day matters, such as:

- ▲ housing issues
- ▲ managing money (ie: budgeting and managing debts)
- ▲ making benefit claims
- ▲ dealing with neighbour or neighbourhood problems
- ▲ safety and security in the home
- ▲ repairs and maintenance
- ▲ applying for jobs, training and education
